B. Direction

- Request to send a Letter of Support to the Governor for Funding for Assembly Bill 1126 (Bloom) - Commission on the State of Hate in the State's Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budget
 - The Liaisons recommend the City support the request by the Human Relations Commission to send a letter of support to Governor Gavin Newsom for funding for the Commission on the State of Hate in the state's fiscal year 2022-2023 budget.

2) Assembly Bill 1651 (Kalra) - Worker rights: Workplace Technology Accountability Act

- The Liaisons have no recommendation for AB 1651. The bill failed to reach the State Assembly floor for a vote and is considered dead.
- 3) Assembly Bill 1771 (Ward) The California Housing Speculation Act: Income Taxes: Capital Gains: Sale or Exchange of Qualified Asset: Housing
 - The Liaisons had conflicting views on AB 1771 and suggested that staff bring back to the full Council for concurrence.
- 4) Assembly Bill 1845 (Calderon) Metropolitan Water District of Southern California: Alternative Project Delivery Methods
 - The Liaisons recommend the City support AB 1845.
- 5) Assembly Bill 2011 (Wicks) Affordable Housing and High Road Jobs Act of 2022
 - The Liaisons recommend the City oppose AB 2011 with extreme prejudice.
- 6) Assembly Bill 2050 (Lee) Residential Real Property: Withdrawal of Accommodations
 - The Liaisons recommend the City support AB 2050.

- A. Assembly Bill 2097 (Friedman) Residential and Commercial Development: Remodeling, Renovations, and Additions: Parking Requirements; AND
- B. Senate Bill 1067 (Portantino) Housing Development Projects: Automobile Parking Requirements
 - The Liaisons recommend the City oppose AB 2097 and SB 1067.
- 8) Assembly Bill 2428 (Ramos) Mitigation Fee Act: Fees for improvements: Timeline for Expenditure
 - The Liaisons have no recommendation for AB 2428. The bill failed to reach the State Assembly floor for a vote and is considered dead.

9) Assembly Bill 2710 (Kalra) - Residential Real Property: Sale of Rental Properties: Right of First Offer

• Vice Mayor Gold recommends that the City oppose AB 2710 and Councilmember Mirisch supports AB 2710 if amended to include tenants, land trusts and nonprofits.

10) Senate Bill 986 (Umberg) - Vehicles: Catalytic Converters

• The Liaisons recommend the City support SB 986.

11) Senate Bill 1456 (Stern) - Property Taxation: Welfare Exemption: Low-Income Housing

• The Liaison recommend the City support SB 1456 if amended to include additional protection for tenants.

12) State and Federal Legislative Updates
